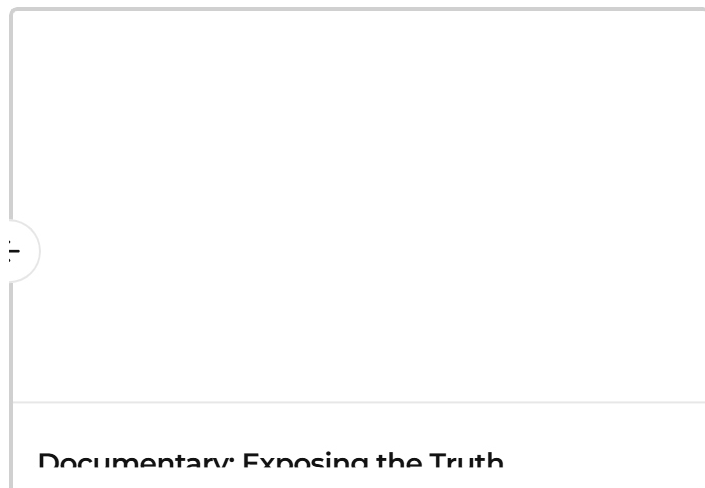


# Mining Scam

## Scam Overview
